## OPENING ACCLAMATION

## COLLECT OF THE DAY

Grant us, O Lord, we pray, the spirit to think and do always those things that are right, that we, who can do no good thing apart from you, may by you be enabled to live according to your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*

## OLD TESTAMENT READING

Ezekiel 2:1-7

And he said to me, “Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak with you.” <sup>2</sup> And as he spoke to me, the Spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard him speaking to me. <sup>3</sup> And he said to me, “Son of man, I send you to the people of Israel, to nations of rebels, who have rebelled against me. They and their fathers have transgressed against me to this very day. <sup>4</sup> The descendants also are impudent and stubborn: I send you to them, and you shall say to them, ‘Thus says the LORD God.’ <sup>5</sup> And whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house) they will know that a prophet has been among them. <sup>6</sup> And you, son of man, be not afraid of them, nor be afraid of their words, though briars and thorns are with you and you sit on scorpions. Be not afraid of their words, nor be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house. <sup>7</sup> And

you shall speak my words to them, whether they hear or refuse to hear, for they are a rebellious house.

*Reader:* The word of the Lord.

***People:* Thanks be to God.**

## PSALTER VERSES

## Psalm 123

<sup>1</sup> Unto you I lift up my eyes, \*

you who are enthroned in the heavens.

<sup>2</sup> Behold, even as the eyes of servants look to the hand of their masters, \*

and as the eyes of a maiden to the hand of her mistress;

<sup>3</sup> Even so our eyes wait upon the LORD our God, \*

until he show us his favor.

<sup>4</sup> Have mercy upon us, O LORD, have mercy upon us, \*

for we have suffered more than enough contempt.

<sup>5</sup> Long has our soul suffered the scorn of the wealthy \*

and the spitefulness of the proud.

## EPISTLE READING

### 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. <sup>3</sup> And I know that this man was caught up into

paradise—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows—<sup>4</sup> and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter.<sup>5</sup> On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses—<sup>6</sup> though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth; but I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me.<sup>7</sup> So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited.<sup>8</sup> Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me.<sup>9</sup> But he said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me.<sup>10</sup> For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

*Reader:* The word of the Lord.

***People:* Thanks be to God.**

## THE HOLY GOSPEL

*Deacon:* The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ, according to St. Mark.

***People:* Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Mark 6:1-6

He went away from there and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him.<sup>2</sup> And on the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished, saying, “Where did this man get these things? What is the wisdom given to him? How are such mighty works done by his hands?”<sup>3</sup> Is not this

the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?” And they took offense at him. <sup>4</sup> And Jesus said to them, “A prophet is not without honor, except in his hometown and among his relatives and in his own household.” <sup>5</sup> And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and healed them. <sup>6</sup> And he marveled because of their unbelief.

And he went about among the villages teaching.

*Deacon:* The Gospel of the Lord.

***People:* Praise to you, Lord Christ.**
